

1. Club Days Monday, all day
 Wednesday, all day
 Friday, all day
 Saturday, 12:00 till dusk
 Tuesday, all day, must be off the water by 7:30pm
 Thursday, all day, must be off the water by 7:30pm
 Sunday, till dusk
2. Powered craft are limited to club days and club waters.
3. Craft must not use the water when the red flag is flown or when visibility is poor e.g. after dusk, in fog or heavy rain.
4. All craft must display their number of readable size in a visible position.
5. All powered craft must be:-
 - a. Of definition a Ski Boat, Runabout or Personal Water Craft
 - b. Have no form of hard top or cabin.
 - c. Inboard engine over 1600 cc or 100Hp without committee approval.
 - d. Engine to be within manufacturers recommendations.
 - e. Drivers of outboards over 90Hp must have BWSC/RYA driver's certificate.
 - f. Hulls over 5M long need Committee approval.
 - g. Each hull and engine to be registered with the club.
6. All powered craft must be insured for the activity it performs, plus third party cover of £250,000.00. Proof to be shown.
7. Only class A),B),C) and F members can drive boats.
8. Craft must keep to the RIGHT of the river and leave the jetty in the downstream direction when other craft are using the water.
9. No more than 4 craft towing skiers to use the water at the same time. Boats towing Skiers and Jetskeirs towing Skiers are permitted to do so at the same time, up to a maximum of 4 craft on the water. Over 4 craft, the craft will be segregated, subject to control by the Officer of the day.
10. Boat control signals to be given and followed.
11. Craft owners are responsible for the safety of their craft and must abide by the safety recommendations set out by the committee.
12. Water skiers to leave the jetty from the downstream end and to return to the area marked "ski in".
13. Consideration and courtesy to be shown to all craft lower powered than you.
14. Juniors must be supervised at all times.
15. Parents are responsible for their children's' behaviour.
16. No fishing on the club premises.
17. All dogs must be kept on a lead and under proper control.
18. No entry to Power Gen. land from the club house premises.
19. Whenever possible, cars to be parked at the far end of the clubhouse.
20. No boats to be moored at the "ski in" or "ski off" points.
21. The use of the RINGO when other craft are on the water is forbidden.
22. When the RED flag is flown ALL the craft on the water must return to the landing stage as soon as it is safe to do so.
23. SAFETY IS TO BE THE MAIN CONSIDERATION AT ALL TIMES.
24. Boating, waterskiing and Jet skiing is not permitted past the upper turning point if fishing is taking place in that area.
25. Before a craft negotiates a change in direction, the driver MUST look over their shoulder to prevent collision with faster moving or overtaking craft.
26. A safe distance is to be kept when following a skier, or from a fallen skier or jet skier in the water.
27. Failure to observe these by laws could result in the owner of the craft being asked to remove their craft from the water, or any other penalty the committee deems appropriate.

Safety Recommendations

1. Jack plug fitted, working and used at all times
2. Engine securing bolts and clamps to be tight.
3. Steering mechanism to be secure and in good working order.
4. Fuel tank and battery to be secured.
5. All seats and fittings to be secured.
6. All equipment used when on the water to be in a safe condition.
7. All crew (including driver) to be seated below the gun whales.
8. All persons on the water to wear a FLOATATION AID.
9. When towing a skier, then an observer must be carried.
10. When water skiing is taking place, all craft to complete the full circuit with the exception for collecting fallen skiers or in emergencies.

BYE LAWS FOR THE USE OF PERSONAL WATER CRAFT BY CHILDREN

1. No children under the age of 14 are allowed to operate PWC, either supervised or unsupervised.
2. Insurance must be checked by a current committee member to ensure a child of 14 plus is covered to drive a PWC*.
3. The committee has no objection to, if agreeable with other members using the water at the time, that a child of 14 plus may have sole use of the water for an agreeable period, enabling him/her to use the PWC on their own.
Providing:-
 - a. The child has been approved by the committee at a committee meeting.
 - b. The child is under close supervision, i.e. at the river bank, from the parent/guardian whilst on the water.
 - c. The child operates the PWC in a responsible manner with regards to other water users and wildlife.
 - d. The child does not tow any inflatable or other device whilst on the water.
4. The committee reserves the right to refuse any child, insured or otherwise from driving a PWC.

***It is the responsibility of the parent/guardian member to carry a copy of their insurance, if they require their child to operate a PWC.**
